## Art Deems, Rest in Peace

We were sorry to learn that long-time friend and "trick" fiddler Art Deems passed away on April 16, 2012 at the age of 89.

Art grew up in West Virginia. He told me that he'd started fiddling when he was very young, and as a teen-ager started performing gigs with older musicians and even on the radio. That is, until his father, concerned that fiddling (and maybe the company he was keeping) were keeping Art from his studies, asked to see his fiddle and then smashed it in front of him. Art said, "I cried, but it was the best thing that could've happened to me." He got back to his studies, went on to college, and eventually became a manager at Lockheed, where he worked until he retired.

For many years Art was a regular at our monthly jams and also at our "payouts" – the fund-raising performances that we do for various groups. Audiences enjoyed hearing him play what he called his "hillbilly junk" music, and he was especially noted for doing various kinds of trick fiddling.

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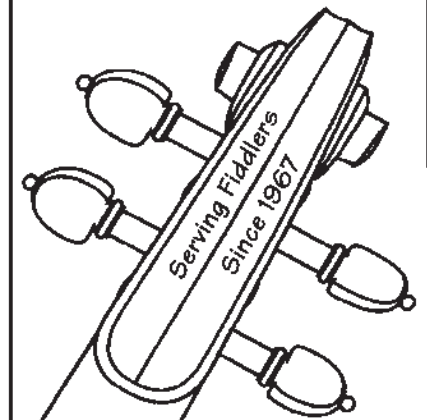

## Traditional Italian folk song

The score is arranged in four systems, each with a Fiddle (Fid.) and Classical Guitar (Gtr.) part. The key signature is three sharps (F#, C#, G#) and the time signature is 3/4. Roman numerals (I-IX) and Arabic numerals (0-4) are used for fretting and fingering. The guitar part includes bar lines (1/2BV), harmonics (circled numbers), and dynamic markings like 'Fine'.

**System 1:** Fiddle starts with notes G4, A4, B4, C5, B4, A4, G4. Chords A and E7 are indicated. Classical guitar accompaniment uses frets 1, 2, 3, 4 and fingering 1, 2, 3, 4. Includes a bar line (1/2BV) and fret I.

**System 2:** Fiddle continues with notes G4, A4, B4, C5, B4, A4, G4. Chords A and E7 are indicated. Classical guitar accompaniment uses frets 2, 3, 4 and fingering 2, 3, 4. Includes a bar line (1/2BV) and fret I.

**System 3:** Fiddle continues with notes G4, A4, B4, C5, B4, A4, G4. Chords VII, 1/2BVII, VII, and BIV are indicated. Classical guitar accompaniment uses frets 3, 4 and fingering 3, 4. Includes a bar line (1/2BV) and fret VII. A circled number 4 indicates a harmonic on the 4th string.

**System 4:** Fiddle continues with notes G4, A4, B4, C5, B4, A4, G4. Chords BII, IV, BII, IX, and D.C. al Fine are indicated. Classical guitar accompaniment uses frets 4, 0, 2, 3 and fingering 4, 0, 2, 3. Includes a bar line (1/2BV) and fret VII. A circled number 4 indicates a harmonic on the 4th string.

Roman numerals show what guitar fret positions to use starting with the index finger. Arabic numbers show what fingers to use for fretting the neck of the guitar ( 0 is an open string). 1/2BV means to bar the guitar neck at the 5th fret using the index finger across only as many strings as necessary. Circled numbers show what strings to use for harmonics ◊ . I.E, (4) means to use the 4th (open D) string of the guitar.

Art would usually start by playing the fiddle while holding it upside-down, then behind his back, and then hold the frog of the bow between his knees while he moved the fiddle against it, continuing to play throughout. In his younger days Art would even form an arch, facing upwards while supported by feet and shoulders on the stage, and fiddle behind his back!

Art was also well-known at area fiddle contests, both as a contestant and an entertainer, including the Cloverdale contest, the California State contest and the National old-time contest in Weiser (ID), and took home prizes a number of times. (As a side note, Art generously donated some of his old trophies to be re-used when we were starting our Youth Fiddle Contest.)

In 2005 Art and his wife Lucy moved to Cumming, Georgia to be near their son. (Lucy passed away in 2009, after some 65 years of marriage.) We were sorry to see him go, but pleased to be able to see and play with him a couple of times when he returned to visit the Bay Area. But our loss was definitely Georgia's gain. 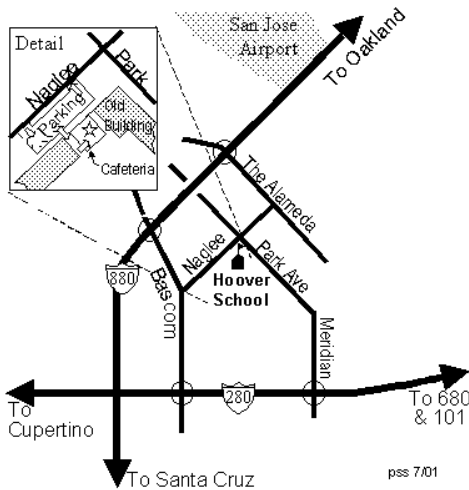
